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Slow Food Plus Scandinavia

The former Maidstone Arms inn on Main Street in East Hampton, which has been renovated by new owners from Sweden and renamed c/o the Maidstone, will contain a restaurant called the Living Room, with James Carpenter, a well-known East End chef, at the helm, assisted by Bjorn Eriksson, a Swedish sous-chef.

According to a press release, the restaurant “will be the standard-bearer for the Slow Food movement in the Hamptons” by showcasing local products as well as sustainably produced foodstuffs from around the world. It will also offer “eco-friendly wines” produced on the East End and worldwide.

The menu at the restaurant, which is slated to open on May 22, will feature “seasonal classics reinterpreted with a Scandinavian hint.”
